

## Congratulations to Barnwell 45's Newest Apprentices

Barnwell School District 45 is excited to announce the selection of two new apprentices with Swiss Krono.

A Swiss Krono Signing Day was held on Monday, December 16, 2019. Two Barnwell High School students, Kenneth Dobson and Jayme Still, began an apprenticeship at Swiss Krono in January of 2020. Both students are currently juniors. Kenneth will be working as a Production Operator, and Jayme will assume the role of an Industrial Maintenance Technician. In addition to the two new apprentices, Nathan Anderson, a Barnwell High School senior, is currently completing his second year in a Production Operator role for the company.

# Barnwell School District 45 Announces a \$391,435 Increase to the District's Reserve Balance

Barnwell District 45's financial standing remains strong, according to its last audit report. In the December 2019 school board meeting, the district announced they had added \$391,435 to the fund balance for the general fund, which is the district's largest operating fund. The district has increased to \$4,440,759 in reserve, which is enough money to cover over three months of district operations.

The district collected \$18,314,131.49 in General Fund Revenue during Fiscal Year 19, an increase of \$107,649.84 from the previous year. The district's net position as of June 30, 2019 increased from the previous year by \$1,407,238 (4.3 percent), according to the audit. According to Steven Strother, the district's Chief Financial Officer, the district's financial standing is positive.

During that meeting, the Superintendent and Board recognized the hard work and dedication of the district's finance department. When discussing the audit, Strother stated, "Change in fund balance is the difference in revenue received and expenses incurred. An increase in fund balance means the district spent less than it received in revenue, thus indicating an increase in its positive financial position."

Auditor David Enzastiga from the Rish & Enzastiga firm commended the district on a strong audit report during the school board's December meeting. According to Superintendent Stapleton, "Both the Board of Trustees and I take very seriously our responsibility to this community and staff to be fiscally accountable. We sincerely appreciate our stakeholders and the Barnwell 45 staff for trusting us to make the decisions that are best for this district we all love so dearly."

Barnwell School District 45 is proud to continue the district's partnership with Anderson Oil Company for a Spirit Pump at the local BP gas station. Each time the gas pump is used, the district receives one cent per gallon of gas. As part of this project, the district designated the funds from this endeavor to support the art

programs across the district, including art classes, band, chorus, and more.

At the January Board of Trustees meeting, Mr. Tuten and his team presented the district with the second Spirit Pump check in the amount of \$1,344.33.

Dr. Rhett Richardson spoke on behalf of the district and expressed gratitude for this partnership, as well as expressing to the audience the impact it has for the district's schools and arts programs.

He was recognized publicly at the January Barnwell School District 45 School Board meeting, and he will be recognized at the statewide Annual Conference in February. # Spotlight on Apprenticeships

The District is excited to announce the expansion of the **Barnwell High School Youth Apprenticeship Program** partnership with Swiss Krono.

The company recently announced an addition of two apprenticeship positions. At the November signing, Nola Grant, Human Resource Director at Swiss Krono, announced the hiring of two more apprentices to be stationed at their new facility during the 2020-2021 school year. Both an Industrial Maintenance Technician and Production Operator position will be created. The addition of a fifth apprentice working in the capacity of a human resources field is also a possibility.

Swiss Krono, located in Barnwell, is an industry leader in the production of laminate flooring. In the fall of 2017, the first registered apprenticeship program in the county was launched through a partnership between Barnwell School District 45 and Swiss Krono. The apprenticeship program is registered and approved through the United States Department of Labor. Through the program, students are provided with opportunities to connect classroom

experiences to career-based internships.

The district continues to extend our gratitude to Swiss Krono for their vision and commitment to our students and community. According to Superintendent Stapleton, "The district extends our sincerest appreciation to Swiss Krono and their vision and commitment to our students and community. We cannot thank the Swiss Krono Administrative Staff enough for this opportunity, and we are so grateful for our staff at Barnwell High School working to make this partnership successful."

The development of this program required an extensive investment from both Barnwell High School and Swiss Krono staff. The district is tremendously appreciative of the

continued assistance provided from Barnwell High School's Career Development Facilitators, JJ Cone and Kaylyn Baxley. Again, the district and the

high school are extremely grateful for the assistance all of the coordinating individuals and agencies provided to develop this wonderful opportunity for our students.

Barnwell High School Principal, Franklin McCormack, stated, "We are so proud of our partnership with Swiss Krono. Our apprentices are gaining on-the-job experiences that will pave the way for them to be career ready prior to graduating from high school. 


### To Our Families and Community Members
